

NB- The entry of £200. on the 15th of April 1777- is in remarkable ink
By referring to a great number of entries in the several books made
at that date, it will appear to be an entry made at the time -
the ink being alike in them all.
This circumstance is strong proof that the Credits were carefully
made at the time - for every entry of the date, as well Credits as
Debits, is in the same col. ink - It is the more remarkable
as the ink was of this colour but for a short time -
