3. I know Jos: Howell's ^{man} was sold but know not I recd the money
4. Joseph Pemberton well knew the manner in which all entries of cash recd. for Hay & Pasture were made he having recourse to the Books.
5. I know not of selling Horses to Joseph Pemberton m^r: or his Father in Law but will remember buying Horses from his Father
6. Scudder bought the mare saddle &c. for £13.0.0.
7. J. P.'s man when charged wth Pasture was not ploughing
8. I know not what time either Hans or Jacob entered or left the Company's service, but will know the cash charged to them they received of me agreeable to the time specified in my Book, — Their Acc^t. of cattle killed & lost I know nothing of — Or Book, I know nothing of
9. John Brag however bound was & continued in the Company's service.
10. Hans & his wife were the Company's concern and deserted to and went off with the British. See no reason why I should be charged wth them
11. The Bateaux was taken away by ^{order of} those in authority for that purpose.
12. at the time I recd. of Price the payment for one Load of Hay £3. — species was equal to the charge of £9. Continental
13. Putting Hay answered as n^o 1
14. During the time the Books were missing the partnership was dissolved & no entries made
