Note - These three books contain the original entries of all the transactions under A. H^o direction & is the same w^{ch} G. A. Baker has reduced to specie in the two books &c. at the former meeting

And also a copy of the account of Continental Horses & Pastured and of Hay sold to the Continent, p^d for by W. H. Schuimer (in red ink) This

This copy is certified by ^{W^m} Simmons for M^r Burrill
and contains a charge of pasturage for 57 horses & 10 horses —
also a charge of \$220 - for expenses paid by Abram Hintzing
for pasturage in bringing those horses from camp, including driver
expenses & pay, and forriages of the horses — But this sum was
deducted by M^r Hitzheimer — and the remainder of the acc^t
paid — Consequently Hintzing deducted that \$22. from
the sum rec^d & credited the remainder to the Comp^y acc^t.
But as that sum (\$22.) was paid in October '76 when the
money was equal to specie, and he rec^d the money for the
pasturage and hay in July '77, when the depreciation was 2½
or 3 for one, he ought in justice to himself to have charged
the difference in value to the Company —

Note — That I delivered to the Auditor at M^r Rice's an Authen-
ticated copy of the rec^t given for the \$1170 Dollars mentioned
by Jon Pemberton as being rec^d by H^e for the pasturage of
the Continental horses, But that rec^t proves (demonstrably)
that the \$1170 Dollars was paid by Jacob Hitzheimer to
Hintzing on account of ten teams sold by him of his
own property to Gen^l Mifflin 2nd of the Continental Army
This copy is said to have been lost — but I am certain of
the delivery, and that Jacob Hitzheimer examined it & de-
clared that it was undoubtedly so
