Dear Sir -

I will furnish all the materials and put on the roof of the Presbyterian Church at Kane, McKean Co. Penna., which church is a building nearly similar in dimensions to the Rev. Mr. Hodge's Presbyterian church at 21st and Columbia Ave. Philad^a, the sectional dimensions of the Principal rafters, purlins, and arches being somewhat increased in the church at Kane, as described in the list of timbers; also erect the joist and cladding for the choir, and furnish the following frames, for the sum of fifteen hundred and twenty dollars, as follows -

The foregoing amount named is exclusive of the workmen's fare and the freight on materials, both of which are to be paid by the church.

I will guarantee ~~the~~ release of all liens for material furnished and work done, before receiving the final payment, but it is understood that as the work progresses I shall receive one half of the above named sum of \$1520.⁰⁰ for the payment of workmen and expenses.

If any material alterations in the character or amount of work is made, affecting the price above named, it must be clearly understood and a written account of the matter made. - The work as it progresses and when finished to be to the satisfaction and approval of Henry J. Taylor
